

Transfer Guide Bachelor of Social Welfare

Pratt Community College

For over 60 years, the University of Kansas School of Social Welfare has provided leadership and innovation in professional social work education. KU has the oldest school of social welfare in the state and the only one to offer degree preparation from the undergraduate level through doctoral degrees. Our Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) graduates consistently outscore the national average on the social work licensing exam. Ninety-eight percent of our BSW graduates are employed or in graduate school soon after commencement. Our distinguished faculty are leading experts in many areas of practice, including: mental health, child welfare and child mental health, aging, spirituality in social work practice, criminal justice, poverty and other areas; and they bring this expertise to the classroom. Given our relatively small class sizes and accessible faculty, students are expected to become engaged in their own learning. They are encouraged to become involved in the life of the School through vibrant student groups and student representation on many School committees.

This transfer guide provides important information and a sample four-semester plan for a student starting at Pratt Community College and transferring to KU for the remaining coursework. School of Social Welfare Admission Requirements

Step One: Admission to the University of Kansas

All incoming students must first apply for admission to the University of Kansas. The application may be completed online at www.admissions.ku.edu. Students must submit official college transcripts from all colleges and universities previously attended. Please note that indicating "social welfare" as your major choice on your application to KU does not grant you entry to the KU School of Social Welfare (see Step Two below). The School of Social Welfare admits for the fall semester only. If you transfer to KU and start in the spring you will be considered a pre-social welfare student in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences until applying and being accepted to the social work program for the following fall. For scholarship consideration, we encourage you to apply to KU by February Ist prior to the fall/summer semester or

Step Two: Admission to the KU School of Social Welfare
Submit a BSW application online at www.socwel.ku.edu/admissions/bsw. Students are admitted for the fall semester only.
New transfer applications should be submitted at least two weeks prior to the June 15 deadline to allow time for references to complete online reference forms. Transfer students are eligible to apply during the semester they will-complete the minimum requirements to apply (see below). In the instance that one or more of the pre-admission criteria has not been completed before two forming to KII the student will be considered a pre-admission leafure to the pre-admission criteria.

has not been completed before transferring to KU, the student will be considered a pre-social welfare student in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences until meeting the minimum requirements to apply to the School.

Requirements to Apply to the KU School of Social Welfare:

Transfer students are eligible to apply during the semester they will complete the minimum application requirements:

1. 36 or more completed transferable credit hours with a 2.5 GPA or higher and

November 1st prior to the spring semester you plan to transfer to KU.

2. Completion of College Algebra (MATH 101) and English Composition 1 and II (ENGL 101 and 102) with a C- or better.

Admission is competitive.

Additional Notes for Transfer Students:

- Transfer credits with earned grades of D+ and below will not satisfy degree requirements. However, they will be included in the transferable GPA.
- If a student takes a course and then repeats it at the same institution, KU will honor the course repeat policy in effect at the institution issuing the transcript. KU does not honor academic forgiveness/renewal policies from other institutions.
- All grades for academically forgiven courses will be included in the transferable GPAs.
- A Bachelor of Social Welfare degree requires a minimum of 120 credit hours of course work, including 12 credit hours of field practicum. At least 30 credit hours must be taken in residence at KU. At least 45 hours must be junior/senior level.
- A student may apply a maximum of 64 credit hours of community college coursework to a KU degree.

- ¹Please view the <u>Bachelor of Social Work Degree Requirements</u> for a list of KU courses that meet the US Cultural Studies degree requirement. You may then select a course that transfers from your college to KU as an equivalent using <u>CredTran</u>. Please contact an advisor if you would like assistance.
- ²The BSW also requires a course equivalent to ECON 104, and either HUM 204 or 205. An equivalent course is not offered at many community colleges. If you would like to complete the ECON requirement prior to transferring you may take courses equivalent to KU's ECON 142 and 144. In addition, courses equivalent to KU's ABSC 160 or PSYC 333 satisfy the EPSY 305 requirement.
- Transfer courses may be matched to a course of opposite level at KU, but the level of credit is defined by the originating institution. (All community college courses are lower level.) It is the STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY to check for updates to all transfer information. This transfer program is provided as a service and is updated annually. Degree requirements are subject to change.
